

We are most grateful to Roy Leslie who prepared the draft plan on the following page for our “new” Church in Willetton.



The plan has been made available to members of the congregation for comment and I am pleased to be able to report that it has met with general approval; in fact, I have only received positive


comments.

The Parish now has to engage a qualified drafter to prepare plans and specifications which will be lodged with the City of Canning for approval. To this end Keith O’Brien and I met with Mathew Whittaker of BuildingLines Approvals during last week. Mathew is preparing a quotation for the preparation of the necessary documents and if the quotation is acceptable, he will prepare them and we will lodge them at the City. Once the City has approved them, a building licence will be granted and refurbishment of the premises can then begin.


Mathew has foreshadowed that there will be some further changes that will have to be made to the plan so that the building can be classified as a “public building”, but they are not major.

It has been a long drawn-out process; unfortunately, there are no shortcuts and we just have to be patient.

At this stage it is not possible to indicate when we will be able to move into the new building.

## Susan sails the high seas

Susan Morisey, a Parishioner of St Peter's, was planning on going on a cruise along the northern coast of Western Australia with her sister and a friend. The voyage would take them from Fremantle to Broome, calling into Exmouth on the way there and Geraldton on the way back. Out of the blue, a thought was planted into her mind: why not do some good and bring some joy to people at the same time? This was just after the devastating floods up North and Susan is convinced that it was the Holy Spirit at work.

She decided to prepare some "Care Bags" to take with her which she could distribute along the way. Each adult bag would contain new items for personal care, a book, pen and gift pack. Those for children would contain colouring-in items, a story book, soft toy, a hand made cross and a book mark with a Bible verse.

Susan was surprised at the generosity of people. Enough contributions were received from St Andrew's Church in Lesmurdie, St Peter's Church in Brentwood, Aglow Western Australia Branches and from many individual friends, for thirty-six Care Bags to be prepared.

Before embarking on the adventure, Susan had already arranged for the delivery of the Bags in Broome, but had no idea how they would be delivered in Exmouth: the Lord would provide, and of course, He did.

The ship on which they sailed had a chapel where those who wished to do so could gather together each morning for worship and to read the scriptures.

On board Susan met Roe and Ken, a couple from Victoria who had already made contact with the Reverend Simon Roberts, and his wife Alison, of the Exmouth Anglican Community Church, who conducted the services. So the delivery of the Bags for Exmouth was solved; again, the Lord had provided! Simon and Alison received ten bags with much appreciation.

In Broome Chris Webb and his wife Karen are supported by the Church Missionary Society of NSW for ministry with Aboriginal people in the Kimberley. Chris received twenty-one Care Bags with much appreciation; ten of which were for children.

This left five bags and one very large suitcase. Once again the Lord provided. They were given to Dennis, their room steward. He was amazed at the generosity shown to him and received this gift with great eagerness.

Susan writes, "We may never know who will receive these gifts. What we do know is Jesus is faithful to each person who does receive them.

# MEETINGS

The **PARISH COUNCIL OF SAINT PETER'S CHURCH** met by Zoom on 18 February 2023 in the morning.



The following are some of the items that were on the agenda:

**AUDITOR'S REPORT:** 2020/2021 and 2021/2022

The Chairman reported that he had not heard from the auditor. He would contact her again as she had apparently been very busy.

**FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

The financial statement as at 31 January 2023 was presented and received and a list of payments for the period 1 November 2022 to 31 January 2023 was approved.

**PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE**

The Chairman confirmed that the public liability insurance for \$10m with Ansvar had been renewed and tabled a copy of a Certificate of Insurance Renewal Schedule and a Certificate of Currency.

**INCORPORATION OF PARISH**

After discussion it was unanimously agreed that the Parish be incorporated under the name "St Peter's Church Inc". This will necessitate amendments to the Constitution of the WA Synod and the Parochial Ordinance and a constitution for the incorporated parish would have to be drawn up. The amendments to the WA Synod Constitution and the proposed constitution would have to be lodged with Consumer Protection and a notice of the application for the incorporation of the parish would have to be published in the *West Australian*. It was estimated that the total cost would be \$300.00-\$400.00. A new ABN and separate public liability would be required. The incorporated association would also have to be registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission. The Chairman would prepare the necessary documents.

**ACQUISITION OF PREMISES IN WILLETTON FOR A CHURCH**

**Settlement of purchase**

The Chairman recorded that settlement of the purchase of the property at 5/27 Augusta Street, Willetton, took place on 19 December 2022.

### **Directional signs**

It was agreed that the Canning City Council be requested to place directional signs on the corners of High Road/Augusta Street and Acanthus Road/Augusta Street with the words "St Peter's Church" on them. As it is uncertain as to when the Parish will actually move into the new premises, the Council is first to be approached to find out how long the Council would take to erect the signs.

The present street sign in front of the unit advertising the Real Estate business could be painted over with the Church's name and would be ideal.

### **Plans**

Mr O'Brien reported that his brother-in-law, Mr Roy Leslie, a Mechanical Engineer and Architectural Designer, is preparing draft plans for the modifications that have to be made to the new premises so that they can be used for worship purposes. Once the plans were complete, they would be presented to parishioners for comment before being handed to a professional draughtsman for the drawing up of plans and specifications for lodging with the City Council for approval.

Mr Leslie has been requested to incorporate some cupboard space in the plan for kitchen appliances and storage of crockery, etc.

### **Tenancies**

It was noted that the tenant of Zone A had vacated the premises rented by her on 31 January 2023. The rent was paid up to date and the bond had been refunded.

The tenant of Zone B is up to date with the rent and owes \$102.90 for electricity consumption.

The lease of her premises expires on 31 October 2023; however, she has requested that the parish agrees to it being terminated on 30 April 2023.

It was agreed that the lease be terminated on 30 April and that any outstanding money at the end of the lease be deducted from the bond money.

### **EASTER OFFERING**

Mrs Morisey suggested that Parishioners be requested to make a thank offering and that it be used for the purposes of the new church.

After discussion it was agreed that this year Parishioners would be requested to make an Easter Thank Offering and that envelopes would be made available for the use of those who wished to do so.

### VISIT BY FR CRAIG LOONEY



Fr Craig Looney of the Parish of St Joseph, San Mateo, California, will be visiting Perth from 12 to 19 July 2023 where he will be staying at the Pan-Pacific Hotel. Fr Craig is interested in trains and museums and collects coins. He intends worshipping at St Peter's on 16 July. The chairman has emailed Fr Craig details of some places that might be of interest to him, such as the Maritime Museum, Mint, Hotham Railway, the Railway Museum at Bassendean and Rottneest.

It was suggested that he might also be interested in visiting the Perth Museum, the Zoo and Cohunu Koala Park.

**NEXT MEETING:** will be held on 13 May 2023 at 10.00am by Zoom.

**DIOCESAN COUNCIL** met by Zoom on 18 February 2023 in the afternoon.



One of the items on the agenda was what the position would be in the event that the See and Diocese of Australia should become vacant.

It was unanimously agreed that:

In the event of the Diocese and See of Australia becoming vacant, the office of Vicar-General shall also become vacant but there shall be an Administrator of the Diocese, who shall be

the clergyman holding office as Vicar-General at such time;

The Administrator shall remain in office as such until such time as a new Bishop Ordinary has been duly installed and enthroned;

The Administrator shall convene a meeting of National Synod for the purposes of electing a new Bishop Ordinary;

In the event that the National Synod shall fail to elect a new Bishop Ordinary:

- A The Administrator shall request the Primate of The Traditional Anglican Church to appoint an Episcopal Visitor to the Diocese and See of Australia for the purposes of exercising spiritual oversight over the Diocese;
- B The Administrator may from time to time and at any time thereafter convene a meeting of the National Synod for the purposes of electing a new Bishop Ordinary and shall, when requested by Diocesan Council, convene such a meeting.

### **NEXT MEETING**

The Council meets again on 20 May 2023 by Zoom.

**MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE** met at 12/37 Boonooloo Road, Kalamunda, on 25 February 2023.



The Chairman, in welcoming those present, particularly mentioned how pleasing it was to see Mrs Hoffman in attendance as she has been ill for some time.

**Auditor's Report**

The Auditor's Report, having been presented and tabled by Ms Turner, the Auditor, was received.

**Vote of thanks**

A vote of thanks proposed by the Chairman thanking Ms Turner for auditing the books in such a thorough and efficient manner was carried by acclamation.

**FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

The Financial Statement as at 31 January 2023, which was presented by the Treasurer, was received.

**PURCHASE OF 5/27 AUGUSTA STREET WILLETTON BY ST PETER'S PARISH**

The Chairman recorded that the purchase of the property at 5/27 Augusta Street, Willetton, had settled on 19 December 2023. The property has been registered in the name of The Traditional Anglican Church in Western Australia Inc and is being held in trust for the Parish of St Peter. He had recently been advised by the solicitor that the certificate of title to the property was now available and he would be collecting it from her offices shortly.

The terms of the mortgage are still to be finalised.

**CHILD SAFETY MINISTRY POLICY**

The Chairman tabled a copy of a Child Safe Ministry Policy that had been discussed at a previous meeting of Diocesan Council, and details of a training course available on the Internet. The course has been developed to provide basic training relating to care and safety of children and vulnerable people.

He was of the view that the Committee should adopt the Policy (amended to reflect local conditions) and that those in a parish who work with children, besides undergoing a Working with Children Check, should also be required to complete the training course. The cost of completing the course is \$38.50; this should be paid by the parish.

He requested that Members let him have any suggested amendments to the Policy document before the next meeting so that at the meeting the amended Policy could be considered and perhaps adopted.

# THE PARISH OF ST JOSEPH, SAN MATEO, CALIFORNIA

In 1797 a Franciscan Order of Spanish monks founded Mission San José. Today it is located in the City of Fremont which is just over forty kilometres by road from San Mateo. Originally a temporary structure with a thatched roof, by 1809 the mission had been replaced by a permanent building of traditional abode (mudbrick). In 1846 the Mission became the parish church of St Joseph.

In 1868 a devastating earthquake damaged the old abode and a replacement wooden church was built in the Carpenter Gothic Revival style. This style of architecture developed as part of the larger Gothic Revival movement, which used elements of a mediaeval architecture style called *Gothic*, to decorate homes and public structures such as churches.

In 1981 it was decided to reconstruct the traditional old adobe mission church on the original site. As this site was now occupied by the 1869 wooden building, the Roman Catholic Church decided to sell the wooden church, with the proviso that it had to be moved to another location. By the early 1980s the Episcopal parish of St Matthew in San Mateo had split with the more conservative parishioners joining the Anglican Catholic Church (now the Traditional Anglican Church) and forming the parish of Christ Church.

The new congregation was in search of a home and bought the wooden church from the Roman Catholic Archdiocese for \$1.00.

As may be imagined, it was a mammoth task moving the 112 year-old structure from Fremont to San Mateo. First, the 80-foot steeple was removed and thirty-three stained glass windows were boxed up. Next, the building was cut up into four pieces which were loaded onto flatbed trucks and on 26 September 1982 the church was conveyed to its new home at El Camino Real and State Street in San Mateo.

The structure, made of redwood, is surprisingly spacious, seating 180. After all the years, and the stress of the move, only one wall had to be replaced.

A basement level was added and by 1985 reconstruction was complete.

In 1992 a new pipe organ was added. The parish spent \$90,000.00 to move the church, and \$1.2 million in renovating it.

In 2004 the Church, being debt free, was consecrated.

The original Rose Window above the Choir Loft depicting St Joseph holding a lily, and the marble statue of St Joseph holding the Christ Child, are vivid reminders of the building's historic connection to Mission San José in Fremont. In recognition of this connection, the parish was placed under the patronage of St Joseph at the time of its dedication in 1846 and in the Season of Trinity, 2014, the parish of Christ Church restored its original identity with St Joseph and became the parish of St Joseph.

Fr Craig Looney is currently the Rector of the Parish.
